

## STATE LICENSURE AUTHORITIES RECOGNIZING AMT'S CERTIFICATION EXAMS FOR MT AND MLT

Currently, twelve (12) states and Puerto Rico (an unincorporated territory of the United States) have some form of personnel licensure for clinical laboratory personnel. The great majority of states do not license lab techs, but rely on the federal CLIA program to assure the quality of testing, including minimum personnel qualifications.

Eleven (11) of the states (and Puerto Rico) that license lab personnel recognize AMT's examinations for MT and MLT for the purpose of satisfying licensure qualifications. Those states are listed below, along with a citation to the pertinent licensing law or regulation:<sup>1, 2</sup>

The only other licensure state that does not recognize AMT is New York, which has a policy of contracting with a single vendor for administering examinations for professional licensing.
