Presentation formats include:

- **Keynote Address:** One-hour program delivered on stage to all annual meeting attendees. Keynote presentations should be informative, engaging, and the speaker should be able to energize the audience and have attendees leave the session enthused for the days ahead.
- **General Session:** One-hour program delivered on stage to all annual meeting attendees. General Sessions should present new industry trends and issues that affect all attendees at every stage of the attendee's career.
- **Workshop:** Multi-hour sessions that provide small group interaction (class sizes may be limited, and additional fees may apply). Workshops include classroom-based learning styles of small group discussions, exercises, and opportunities to practice applying concepts.
- **CE Session:** One-hour breakout session (up to 75 attendees).

- All program proposals submitted via the official site will be reviewed by the AMT Scientific/Speakers Committee.
